## James Hofacker

He was extremely proud to be honored twice — 1994 and 2009 — as Grand Marshall — for the Ladysmith Homecoming Parade.


He was elected to the Rusk County Board of Supervisors with a writein vote in 1992 and has never had any election opposition in that post, which he has held for the past 18 years.
