

Rusk County Campground Rules and Regulations

This is not intended to be the complete rules, regulations and ordinances governing the Rusk County Campgrounds. For the Complete rules consult Chapter 34 of the Rusk County Ordinance. This is a quick reference of the most common rules.

No Littering. Individual glass beverage containers are prohibited in the park. They may be used only within the campsite area for which you have been registered. Cigarette butts are considered litter.

Fires much be in provided Fire Ring. It is unlawful to burn anything other than wood and paper product. **ALL** other items must be disposed of properly.

Operation of ATV's in the park is prohibited, except in Josie Creek Campground.

No loud or continuous noises, such as radios that can be heard while standing in the next campsite, or continuous operation of generators. **Absolute Quiet Hours are from 10PM to 6AM.**

No Fireworks

No discharging any firearms. It is also unlawful to use air-powered rifles or pistols within the entire park area. All weapons must be unloaded and cased at all times within the park area.

Pets must be controlled at all times. Pet owners must clean up after their pets.

No Horses

No cutting of live trees or shrubs. Firewood may not be brought from more than 25 miles to this campground. Dead and down trees and branches may be collected for firewood from the area surrounding the campground.

No more than one camping unit per site. Unless the camping fees are paid for each unit.

A Maximum of 6 persons per site. The only exception to this rule is if all campers are family members. (A family group may also include up to 2 juvenile guests)

The park speed limit is 10 miles per hour.
