

Jail Regulations for Inmate Visitation

The following are rules and regulations established by the Rusk County Sheriff and/or his designees. Any violation may result in the termination of your visit and/or possible suspension of future visitation privileges.

Visitation Hours:

- **Tuesdays** – 7pm to 9pm
- **Saturdays** – 1pm to 5pm and 7pm to 9pm
- **Sundays** – 1pm to 5pm and 7pm to 9pm

Visiting Rules and Regulations:

- Visits are for approximately 25-30 minutes.
- Inmate gets one visit per week. A week is Tuesday through Sunday.
- All visits will be by phone through glass. **NO CONTACT VISITS ALLOWED.**
- Hour visits may be requested by the inmate.
- All visits are subject to recording.
- Inmate must be housed in general population.
- Permitted visitors must schedule their visit 24 hours in advance.
- Visitors are allowed to visit only one inmate within the facility. Exceptions can be made for family members. This exception must be approved by the Jail Administrator prior to the visit.
- Visitors who cannot make their scheduled visitation must call and cancel prior to their scheduled visit. Failure to do so, that visitor will not be allowed to visit for 2 weeks.
- There may only be two visitors per inmate at a time in the jail lobby. If your group has more than two, the other visitor must wait downstairs.
- All visitors must present identification prior to visiting.
- All intended visitors must be listed on the visitation schedule. If you are not listed, you will not be allowed to visit.
- Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Children under the age of 12 will be limited to biological children or step children only. These children must not disrupt the other visits. Exceptions can be made on a case by case basis if requested by the inmate prior to the scheduled visitation.
- Visitors who may be or appear to be under the influence will be denied.

- Cell phones, cameras or any kind of recording devices are **NOT ALLOWED** in the visitation area.
- Any visitors who become disruptive or disrespectful at any time will be told to leave.
- No visits will be allowed by any/all former inmates of the Rusk County Jail for 90 days from the date the former inmate was released from jail.
- Any no contacts issued by the court, probation ect., will be enforced.
- Visits may be suspended or cancelled at any time due to unacceptable behavior or any kind of emergency to include severe weather.
- Requests for exceptions to visitation must be submitted in writing. Such requests must provide a detailed explanation as to the need for the exception and specify dates, times and names ect.
- The jail staff may deny any visit to any person when, in the jailers opinion, allowing the visit may present a threat to the safety of those concerned or have a potential to interfered with the security or orderly operation of the jail.
- Scheduled visitations may be cancelled at any time for disciplinary reasons. It is the visitor's responsibility to have a current contact number on file. Failure to do so will result in an inconvenience for the visitor.
- Hour visits must be requested by the inmate and be approved by the jail staff prior to being scheduled.
