The Rusk County Sheriff's Office is accepting applications for one part-time (80%) patrol deputy sheriff position and to establish a 12-month eligibility list for future part-time and full-time patrol deputies.

Basic information about the position, wage rate, scheduling, and qualifications are as follows:

Starting wage 1/1/17: \$21.04/hour - Sheriff's patrol deputy (based on current contract)

Benefits: Per union contract

Vacation: First year – none

Work Schedule: 12 hour shifts (part-time vacancy to average 80% of full-time schedule)

Qualifications: Minimum of 60 college credits from an accredited institution and Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board certified.

Candidates will complete a brief application, select a test location, time and date, and select which sheriffs they want to receive their records and test scores. Be sure to select Rusk County. **The test must be completed and passed no later than December 15, 2016.** There is a fee to take the examination.

Interviews: After the application deadline, Rusk County will select qualified applicants for interviews.
