Christmas Recycling Q & A

Christmas Paper & Cards - No. Our recycled paper gets sold to companies that use it to make new paper products such as toilet paper, napkins, tissues, etc. The major colors in wrapping paper and cards including the metallics and sparkles cause issues in the pulping process. The pulp can't be bleached enough. The brown paper tubes that your wrapping paper comes on **can** be recycled. Try making gift cards out of your old cards.

Holiday Tins? Yes. Includes popcorn, spices/cocoa/ candy and candle tins. They need to be clean and try to flatten them so they take up less space.

Rechargeable Batteries for Stocking Stuffers

If your child has or is expected to receive battery-operated toys this season, buy a small battery recharger and give rechargeable batteries either as a present or stocking stuffer. Rechargeable batteries cost more initially, but they can be reused many times. They will be cheaper than always buying new batteries and are better for the environment. Give the gift that keeps on giving!
