

WHO IS REQUIRED TO RECYCLE IN WI?

Everyone, everywhere, all the time!

Wisconsin's recycling requirements apply to everyone in the state, at all locations. This includes schools, public places, businesses, special events, homes and apartments.

LANDFILL BANS IN WI

The following items are banned from WI landfills and must be recycled. Some communities go above and beyond what is required by law.

- ♻️ Plastic containers including milk jugs and detergent, soda & water bottles
- ♻️ Aluminum, Steel & Bi-metal containers
- ♻️ Glass containers
- ♻️ Magazines, catalogs and junk mail
- ♻️ Newspaper and office paper
- ♻️ Corrugated & other container board
- ♻️ Major appliances, including air conditioners, clothes washers and dryers, dishwasher, refrigerators, freezers, stoves, ovens, dehumidifiers, furnaces, boilers and water heaters
- ♻️ Yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, yard and garden debris and brush under 6" in diameter
- ♻️ Lead acid batteries
- ♻️ Computers, televisions, desktop printers, computer peripherals, DVD players, VCRs, digital video recorders, fax machines, phones with video displays
- ♻️ Used automotive oil & filters
- ♻️ Used tires

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING ALL ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN ONE CONTAINER!

City of Ladysmith is Dual Sort and follows an every other week schedule.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

PAPER

- ♻️ Corrugated Cardboard (flattened)
- ♻️ Paperboard (not food tainted)
- ♻️ Brown Paper Bags
- ♻️ Magazines, Catalogs, and Newspapers
- ♻️ Office Paper, Envelopes, and Junk Mail
- ♻️ Shredded Paper (must be in closed paper bag)
- ♻️ Phone Books (don't need to remove cover)
- ♻️ Paperback Books, Empty Paper Towel & Toilet Paper Rolls
- ♻️ Milk, Juice, Broth and Soup Cartons (rinse & empty)



GLASS/METAL/PLASTIC

- ♻️ Aluminum Cans
- ♻️ Clean Aluminum Foil (balled up) and Pie Tins
- ♻️ Glass Bottles and Jars (recycle metal lids separately)
- ♻️ Metal Cans (food metal only)
- ♻️ Plastic Bottles & Jars (any # 1 – 7*)
- ♻️ Plastic Containers, Tubs, & Lids (any # 1 – 7*)
- ♻️ Plastic Hanging/Potted Plant Containers up to 8 "
- ♻️ Empty Aerosol Cans (MUST be empty – leave lids on)



* No PS #6

PREPARATION

- ☺️ Rinse food from all containers
- ☺️ Can leave lids & caps on – except for glass jars
- ☺️ No need to remove labels
- ☺️ Break down all large items to maximize space (cardboard no greater than 3' x 3')
- ☺️ Please don't leave liquids in recyclables

NOT-ACCEPTABLE

- ☹️ Plastic Bags, Plastic Wrap or Film
- ☹️ Ceramic, Porcelain, or Crystal Glass
- ☹️ Food Waste & Food-tainted paper
- ☹️ No Styrofoam Cups & Containers
- ☹️ Napkins, Tissues, Paper Towels
- ☹️ Hazardous Waste/Needles/Syringes
- ☹️ No Scrap Metal or Electronics

YARD WASTE

Compost improves low quality soils by adding organic matter and nutrients. Plants grown in good soil are healthier and have greater resistance to diseases and insects.

What to compost

DO COMPOST: grass clippings, leaves, weeds & garden debris, small brush, twigs, wood ash, sawdust & wood chips, egg shells, and coffee grounds

DON'T COMPOST: meat, bones, fat, dairy products, oils, whole branches, logs, pet or human waste, charcoal briquette ash, sawdust or ash from treated wood

How to compost

All you need to compost are some basic gardening tools, materials for a bin, and a bit of soil to start the process. The bin needs to have air running through it, so snow fencing, bricks, and woven wire make excellent bin walls.

RECIPE: Mix one part green yard waste with two parts brown yard waste in a pile. Mix in one inch of soil. Keep pile as moist as a wrung-out sponge. Turn pile every week to let air in. In between four weeks and a year, depending on how often you turn it and how moist the pile is kept, you will have a batch of compost.

Uses for compost

Finished compost is a crumbly, sweet smelling dirt-like substance. It can be used on the lawn, for potted plants, tree & shrub planting, in the garden, as mulch, and starter mixes.

Information packets are available at the Recycling Dept. along with diagrams on how to build your own bin.



RUSK COUNTY RESPONSIBLE UNIT

The Rusk County Responsible Unit consists of most of Rusk County except Villages of Tony & Weyerhaeuser; Towns of Big Falls, Dewey and Grow.

RUSK COUNTY RECYCLING ORDINANCE

applies to all residences, multi-family, commercial and industrial entities in the Rusk County Responsible Unit. The ordinance requires separation of garbage from recyclable items. Penalties for violating this ordinance can be fines not less than \$10 or more than \$1,000 for each violation.

OFFICE COLLECTIONS

The Recycling Department collects the following from residents at no charge:

- ♻️ Printer Cartridges (Inkjet & Laser)
- ♻️ Cell Phones
- ♻️ Rechargeable & Button Batteries
- ♻️ Mercury Fever Thermometers
- ♻️ Mercury Switches
- ♻️ Fluorescent Bulbs (Fee Charged)
 - \$.60 Tubes 4' and under
 - \$.85 Tubes > 4'

CLEANSWEEP & TIRE RECYCLING

There is an annual Cleansweep program in Rusk County for household hazardous waste including pesticides, non-latex paint, chemicals, fertilizers and much more. There are also additional collections for appliances, electronics, tires, and pharmaceuticals. It is usually held the 3rd weekend in June.

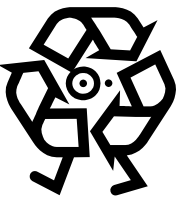
